

## Things Parents & Campers Should Know (camp rules):

- Campers and visitors are required to respect the camp rules, dress code and schedule (be on time and in the right place).
- All clothing must be modest and appropriate to the Christian environment (including swimwear at the pool). There will be no sleeveless shirts or open midriffs. All clothing must be knee length or longer. Visitors to the camp are also expected to wear clothing in harmony with the camp dress code.
- All campers will attend Bible classes, devotionals, chapel services, evening worship and all other activities unless excused by the camp nurse or director.
- All campers must be in their own quarters after lights out.
- Campers, staff, parents and guests must leave pets at home.
- Offensive language has no place at camp. No put-downs or gossip.
- Thou shalt not run on gravels or thou will have skinned knees.
- Absolutely no use of illegal drugs, alcohol or tobacco products is allowed by campers, staff or visitors. TCC is a tobacco free campus.
- The destruction of property or wildlife will not be permitted.
- All hikers will be in groups under responsible leaders.
- DVD players, televisions, multi-outlet plug strips or refrigerators will NOT be allowed for campers. Cell phones are welcome for emergency use only or when approved by the camp director.
- No one is permitted to leave the camp without permission from the camp director.
- The directors reserve the right to send any person home if, in the director's judgment, such action will improve the camp. Under such circumstances, no refund will be made. The camper sent home will be suspended for 12 months from any future sessions of TCC.
- The camp directors must be informed of every situation that might affect the welfare of the camping session.

  - Times of dosages.
- All medications must be registered and kept with the camp nurse.
- All visitors are to refrain from the use of tobacco products on the camp property.
- Visitors are requested to limit the number of visits to campers.
